







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## Adding the Suffix -Ous

I can use and spell words correctly with the suffix –ous.

Spelling Rule	Example Words
-our is changed to -or before -ous is added.	humorous
A final e of the root word must be kept if the word ends in ge.	outrageous
If there is an i sound before the <b>-Ous</b> ending, it is usually spelt as i. A few words have an <b>e</b> .	obvious hideous
Sometimes there is no obvious root word.	enormous

courageous	fabulous
