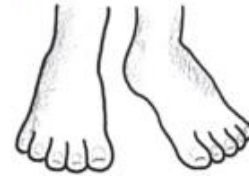
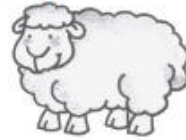
The ee sound
