4.	On page two, line three "he ate the bread ravenously", what does the word ravenously imply?
5.	From your reading, how can you infer that the man was very cold? Refer to the passage.
6.	Which of the below words are connected to Pip and which to the fearful man? How did Dickens use them to portray both characters and give impressions about them?
