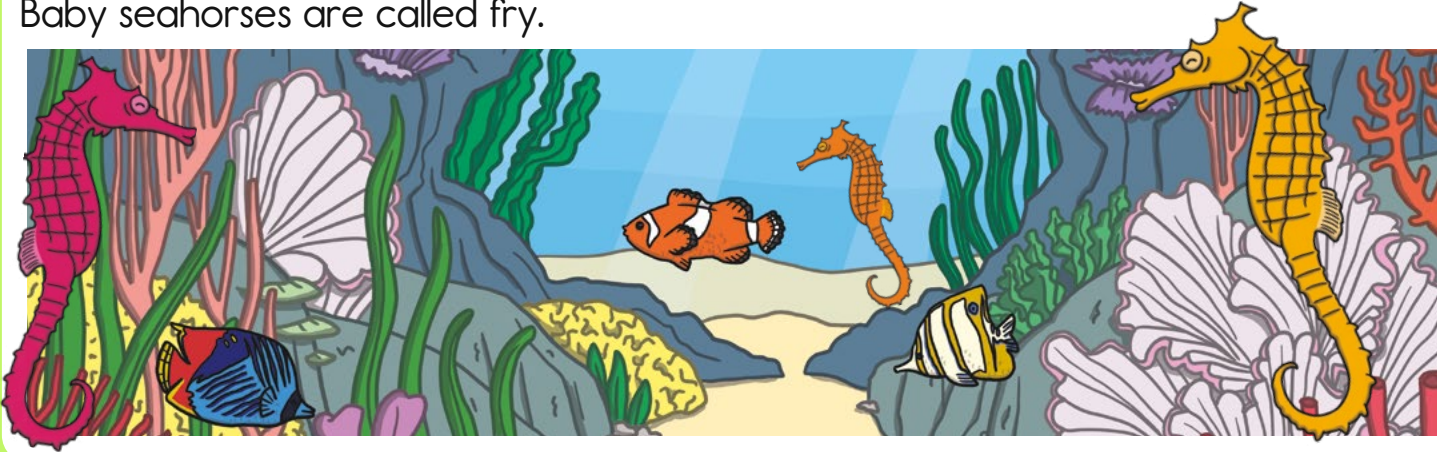


Seahorses



Seahorses are fish. They live in warm waters. They live in seagrass or coral reefs. Seahorses do not have scales. They have skin. Seahorses look like horses. They have a long bent neck. They have long tails. Their tails keep them in place. They use their fins to move. They also swim upright. They can hide themselves. This helps them hide from other animals that might eat them.

Seahorses eat small shrimp. They use their long mouths to eat. The female seahorse lays eggs. The male seahorse carries them in a sac in their tummies. Baby seahorses are called fry.
