Definitions

- Estuary - the tidal mouth of a large river, where the tide meets the stream
- Channel - A channel is a landform on which a relatively narrow body of water is situated, such as a river, river delta or strait¹. The deepest part of a river bed is called a channel, which is usually located in the middle of a river
- Meander - A meander is an extreme U-bend during a stream
- Bank - In limnology, a stream bank or river bank is the terrain alongside the bed of a river, creek, or stream
- Gorge - - A gorge is a deep channel formed by a river that has eroded the earth's crust over millions of years
- Mouth- A river mouth is the part of a river where the river flows into a larger body of water
