

3. Conclusion (1 paragraph):

- **Summarize**: Briefly restate the main points about the invention and its creation.
- Impact: Briefly mention the impact of the invention on our lives.

Bonus:

• **Diagrams or pictures:** Include simple diagrams or pictures to illustrate the invention or its creation process (optional).

Tips:

- Focus on the main steps: Don't go into too much technical detail.
- Simple sentences: Use short and clear sentences.
- **Grammar and Punctuation:** Focus on proper sentence structure, subject-verb agreement, and basic punctuation.
