Forming Nouns Using -er



Aim

• I can form nouns by adding -er to verbs.

What is a verb?

What is a noun?

A verb is an action or a 'doing' word. A noun is the name of something


or someone.





Bradley was asked by his teacher to put the noun and verb cards away. However, he dropped them and now they are all mixed up! Can you help him to sort them out?

Here are some of the words he dropped:





Which are nouns and which are verbs?



Bradley collected all of the noun cards together and noticed something interesting:

walker
driver
teacher
swimmer

What do you notice about all these nouns?

Some nouns can be formed by adding the suffix **-er** to the end of verbs.



Look at these words. Can you see how adding **-er** changes them from a verb into a noun?

Verb	Noun
teach	teacher
drive	driver
sing	singer
paint	painter

Making Nouns by Adding -er



When we change verbs into nouns, most of the time we can just add -er.

$$walk + er = walker$$

$$play + er = player$$

But sometimes it is trickier!

When the word ends in an 'e', we knock off the 'e' before adding -er:


$$drive \longrightarrow driv + er = driver$$

Making Nouns by Adding -er



Look carefully at these verbs. They end in a consonant and a 'y'.

worry carry



When a verb ends in a consonant and the letter 'y', we need to change the 'y' to an 'i', then add -er.

Making Nouns by Adding -er



Look carefully at these verbs. They end in a vowel and one consonant.

drum run swim

swim — consonant

short vowel sound

When a verb ends in a vowel and one consonant, we need to double the last consonant to keep the vowel sound short.

swim
$$\longrightarrow$$
 swimm + er = **swimmer**

$$jog \longrightarrow jogg + er = jogger$$
