

# Exercise Sheet: Active vs Passive Voice

Active voice occurs when a clear subject performs a clear action.

*Passive voice* occurs when one uses a "to-be" verb (*am, is, are, was, were, be, being, been*) with a past tense verb. Sentences with "to-be" verbs are passive because they describe an object rather than show action.

Sentences that have personal pronouns or abstract concepts as their subjects sometimes only make sense in passive voice.

## CHANGING PASSIVE VOICE TO ACTIVE VOICE

- 1. **Find the action** First, if there is a verb connected to the "to-be" verb of the sentence, then it may be the main action. If the only verb in the sentence is a "to-be" verb, then it must be replaced with an action.
- 2. **Determine the "doer" of the action** Next, find the "doer," or subject, of the action. This "doer" may be in the sentence or a previous sentence.
- 3. **Rearrange the sentence** Finally, rearrange the sentence so that the new subject and its following action are at the beginning of the sentence.
- 4. **Polish the sentence** Check your sentence to make sure that it flows well. If part of the sentence sounds awkward, consider changing your wording.

#### **EXAMPLES**

- 1. The paper was written by Colin. (*Passive Voice*)
  - **Find the action**: The paper was **written** by Colin.
  - Determine the "doer": The paper was written by Colin.
  - Rearrange the sentence: Colin wrote the paper. (Active Voice)
- 2. There was a vast wealth of knowledge in the book that Becky read.
  - **Find the action**: There was a vast wealth of knowledge in the book that Becky **read**.
  - Determine the "doer": There was a vast wealth of knowledge in the book that Becky read.
  - Rearrange the sentence: Becky read a vast wealth of knowledge in the book. (Active Voice)
  - Polish the sentence: Becky discovered a vast wealth of knowledge in her book. (Active Voice)

### Exercises

# Exercises: Answers

1. The coffee was still boiling after it was served.

**Answer:** Passive voice. **Revision:** The coffee still boiled after Angela served it.

2. The students worked on their papers all night.

**Answer:** Active voice. **Subject:** the students. **Verb:** worked.

3. The wind was making the tree sway.

**Answer:** Passive voice. **Revision:** The wind made the tree sway.

4. Kana has been holding her hand up to answer the question.

**Answer:** Passive voice. **Revision:** Kana held her hand up to answer the question.

5. The three dogs were being walked.

**Answer:** Passive voice. **Revision:** Joe walked his three dogs.

6. The earth continually spins on its axis.

**Answer:** Active voice. **Subject:** the earth. **Verb:** spins.

7. The students were released from class.

**Answer:** Passive voice. **Revision:** The teacher released the students from class.

8. Nathaniel gave his speech flawlessly.

Answer: Active voice. Subject: Nathaniel. Verb: gave.

9. Without interruption, the scarf was knit by Margot.

Answer: Passive voice. Revision: Without interruption, Margot knit the scarf.

10. We were driven to the beach by Caleb in his minivan.

**Answer:** Passive voice. **Revision:** Caleb drove us to the beach in his minivan.

11. The class was taught by Heather in the evenings.

**Answer:** Passive voice. **Revision:** Heather taught the class in the evenings.

12. Café Moka closed early, so Danielle brewed her own pot of coffee.

**Answer:** Active voice. **Subjects:** Café Moka, Danielle. **Verbs:** closed, brewed.

13. The professor and her aid passed out the exam, and it was taken by the students.

**Answer:** Active voice, Passive voice. **Subjects:** the professor and her aid. **Verb:** passed.

**Revision:** The professor and her aid passed out the exam, and the students took it.

14. Griff explained the importance of proofreading one's sentences.

**Answer:** Active voice. **Subject:** Griff. **Verb:** explained.

**Answer:** Passive voice. **Revision:** You finished the exercise sheet!
